

PCH DNSSEC Event Record

On Thursday, April 10, 2014, SC1 Bill WOODCOCK configured key K6000080F with a credential sufficient to open the top and bottom doors of the Zurich SCIF for a period of fourteen days, expiring at midnight UTC on Friday, April 25, 2014. The key was sent from Berkeley to Zurich on Sunday, April 13, 2014, under FedEx Air Waybill 798512109830, signed for at the front reception desk by F. KRUENZLI at 11:12am on Wednesday, April 16, 2014. FedEx package tracking and proof-of-signature are appended to this document.

The undersigned affirm that on Wednesday, April 23, 2014 at 17:00 local Zurich time, Daniel STIRNIMANN, a SWITCH employee acting on behalf of and under the remote video supervision of SC1 Bill WOODCOCK, entered the PCH Zurich Zone Signing Facility vault, and used the aforementioned key to open and close first the bottom door of the SCIF, then open the top door of the SCIF, place the key inside, and close the top door of the SCIF. This action was performed as a diagnostic measure related to the apparent failure of the green LED strip which indicates the proper closure of the SCIF doors. The undersigned affirm that Daniel STIRNIMANN did not touch or otherwise affect the contents of the SCIF, particularly the IPS, which was observed to be closed. The key was left inside the top section of the SCIF for safekeeping until the expiry of its credential. The undersigned affirm that between its receipt on Wednesday, April 16, 2014 and its use on Wednesday, April 23, 2014, the key was at all times stored in SWITCH's safe, and was not accessed.
